### NOTEWORTHY JAZZ ENSEMBLE

*"Practicing What They Teach."*

Quite possibly the only band of its kind in the country, Noteworthy Jazz Ensemble is an ensemble comprised of Chicago Public School music teachers, many of whom are also the jazz band directors at their schools. The idea to form a band came about as an outgrowth of the Jazz Institute of Chicago's Jazz Links Teachers Advisory Council. After suggesting that they could create an opportunity to "practice what they teach" the band grew quickly from an octet to a burgeoning big band. The ensemble members see the possibility for establishing Noteworthy as a model for music teachers across the country, especially as a tool to increase and build awareness and advocacy for arts education.

This month, Noteworthy will travel to Peoria, IL to perform and present at the Illinois Music Education Association Conference (IMEA). Noteworthy will work with music educators from throughout the state in a panel discussion format to discuss how the unique 'teacher ensemble' model can benefit both classroom and personal music practices.
